'Mhaji Ghar' Scheme to Benefit 50% Goans: CM Sawant

■ We will officially launch the 'Mhaji Ghar' scheme in presence of Home Min Amit Shah

PANAJI: Chief Minister Pramod Sawant today announced the launch of the Mhaji Ghar scheme, which he said will benefit nearly 50 percent of Goa's population. Sawant said that following the scheme's launch, notifications are being issued in connection with Communidade land, the 20-point programme and government land. "Once all legal matters are settled, application forms will be made available. We will officially launch the 'Mhaji Ghar' scheme in the presence of Home Minister Amit Shah," the Chief Minister said. He further added that even families rehabilitated nearly three decades ago under earlier housing programmes will now be granted ownership of their flats.



The scheme, according to the government, is aimed at addressing long-pending housing and land ownership issues in the state. Under the new policy, plots in Category A, where allottees have built houses and are residing with their families or legal heirs, will be converted from Class-II to Class-I by issuing a Sanad. This will be subject to the payment of a premium equivalent to 1/20th of the fair market value or

minimum land rate as notified by the governmentCategory B includes vacant and unused plots where allottees have not taken possession or constructed houses. These will be reverted to the government, with District Collectors empowered to take possession.Category C covers cases where original allottees have unauthorisedly transferred possession to third parties who have since constructed and occupied houses. Such plots will be regularised on a one-time basis, with Sanads issued under Class-I occupancy, subject to payment of a premium of 1/20th of the fair market value and a penalty of an equivalent amount provided that such unauthorized possession of the plot has been obtained prior to February 28, 2014.



Is Goa Doing Enough to Save Mhadei?

he Mhadei river is more than a natural resource. For Goa, it is a lifeline that sustains drinking water, forests, agriculture, and biodiversity. Yet the battle over its waters has dragged on for decades, and today the big question stares us in the face: has Goa really done enough to save Mhadei, or are we slowly ceding ground to Karnataka?

The recent meeting of the Mhadei Bachao Abhiyan (MBA) with Chief Minister Pramod Sawant brings this unease back into focus. The delegation asked for police protection to visit the Kankumbi and Bhandura sites, where diversion works are reportedly underway. They pressed for an aerial survey, a joint inspection, faster hearings in the Supreme Court, and even a meeting with the Union Environment Minister to discuss ecological concerns.

These demands sound reasonable. If Karnataka is indeed moving ahead with construction, why should citizens have to beg for something as basic as an official inspection or statelevel intervention?

But there is also another side to the debate. The government insists that it is fighting the case in the Supreme Court, that legal processes take time, and that matters concerning inter-state rivers are never straightforward.

To be fair, Goa has not been silent in this battle. It has challenged Karnataka in multiple legal forums and secured earlier rulings in its favour. It has raised objections to central clearances and highlighted the ecological damage that diversion will cause. Yet the perception persists that Karnataka is several steps ahead, pushing its agenda consistently, while Goa reacts only when activists raise alarms.

This perception is not without reason.

Karnataka has been relentless. For years it

petitions, and pressure campaigns. Without their persistence, it is possible that public discourse around Mhadei would have faded even further. But can NGOs, no matter how dedicated, shoulder the responsibility of protecting a river of such critical importance? Should it not be the government's job to lead from the front, rather than wait to be nudged into action?There is also the larger question of public participation.

Why does Mhadei not stir the same emotions as other movements in Goa? Is it because the impact of diversion is not immediately visible to most citizens?

For now, taps in Panaji and Margao still flow, and paddy fields in Ponda are still green. But what happens when the river's flow reduces, when forests dry out, and when saline intrusion spoils our freshwater? By the time the impact is felt in everyday life, will it be too late to act.

The Chief Minister now stands at a crossroads.

He can choose to treat the latest warning bells from MBA as yet another routine complaint, or he can take bold steps to prove that Goa will not give up its lifeline without a fight. That means pushing for urgent hearings in the Supreme Court, ensuring on-ground inspections, and demanding accountability from the Centre for the clearances given. It also means convincing Goans that this is not just an environmental issue but a survival issue. So, are the MBA's demands justified? Given the stakes, yes, they appear both urgent and necessary. But the bigger question is whether the government will act on them decisively or whether Goa will continue to play catch -up while Karnataka steadily strengthens its position.

The battle for Mhadei is far from over. But if Goa does not show the same persistence as Karnataka, the outcome may already be tilting away from us.

Goa to Launch Statewide Cleanliness Campaign to Boost Tourism & Sustainable Living

Transport Dept Allows Taxi Operators to Choose Fare Meter Vendors

GPS linked fare meters now mandatory for tourist taxis

PANAJI: The Directorate of Transport, Goa, has issued a public notice clarifying that motor cab operators can now purchase digital fare meters with GPS tracking from any approved vendor, following requests from various taxi operators. Earlier, the Department had empanelled only two vendors through Goa Electronics Limited for the fitment of fare meters.

However, after considering requests from taxi operators, the



Directorate has allowed the choice of vendor, provided the device complies with Rule 140 of the Goa Motor Vehicle Rules, 1991. The notice emphasizes that all fare meters must have an intact seal from the Legal Metrology Department, confirming that the device has been tested and is in proper working condition.

20-Point Scheme: Goa MLA Michael Lobo Flags Waste Management **Issues, Calls for Cleaner Beaches in Goa**

CALANGUTE: Highlighting the growing garbage problem along Goa's coastal belt, Calangute MLA Michael Lobo has raised concerns over both the performance of the waste management facility and the littering habits of domestic tourists.

Speaking on the issue, Lobo acknowledged the efforts of the earlier team managing the state's waste treatment facility but said the new staff are not performing up to the mark.

"I have spoken to the Chief Minister regarding this, and he will



hold a meeting at the plant this week or by Monday to ensure that the facility functions as it did before," Lobo said. He added that for the coastal belt, the plant has a capacity of 250 tonnes, and any load beyond this would make it unsustainable.

Lobo also emphasized that Mormugao Taluka should have its own treatment facility, even if small, to manage local waste efficiently.

Turning to the issue of public behavior, Lobo criticized domestic tourists for littering. "Littering is inbuilt in Indian tourists," he said, citing repeated appeals for cleanliness under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. He urged visitors to follow the PM's example, noting Modi's personal participation in a beach cleanup in Lakshadweep and his call for citizens to maintain clean beaches across India.

GCCI Urges Centre to Spare Low-Grade Iron Ore from Export Duty

G. Kishan Reddy, GCCI President Pratima Dhond raised concerns over reports that export duty may be extended to iron ore fines and lumps with less than 58% iron content. The speculation stems from discussions at a stakeholders' meeting on August 26 and the formation of an Advisory Committee on August 28, whose Terms of Reference included a clause hinting at such a levy.

Pointing to the controversy over Kala Academy, Chodankar alleged that the BJP government had "looted" funds in its refurbishment. "I agree with Tawadkar that these departments are bankrupt, and that may be only because the BJP government has looted them," he said.

Cyber Crime Police Arrest 19-Year-Old in 80 Lakh 'Digital Arrest'

The case was registered under Crime No. 28/2025 for offences under Sections 318(4), 319(2) r/w 3(5) of the BNS, 2023, and Section 66-D of the IT



Act, 2000. According to the complaint filed by a 59-year-old resident of Canacona, the fraudsters, using WhatsApp numbers with Maharashtra and other codes, impersonated officials of NCRB, Sahar Police Station, and a public prosecutor. They falsely accused the victim of sending offensive messages against Hindu religion and the Government of India using a SIM card allegedly issued with his Aadhaar details.

Police said the seized products have been taken into



custody for legal proceedings and warned that strict action will continue against those found violating the ban on the sale of tobacco near schools.

Washington: Tyler Robinson, the 22-year-old accused of fatally shooting conservative activist Charlie Kirk, allegedly confessed in a series of text messages to his transgender partner shortly after the killing, according to newly released court documents.Kirk, 31, founder of the right-wing group Turning Point USA, was shot in the neck by a rifle while speaking at Utah Valley University last week. Robinson was arrested a day later and made his first court appearance in Utah, facing murder and related charges in a case that has drawn sharp political reaction from Donald Trump and his allies, who point to it as evidence of rising violence against conservatives. Texts and notes reveal intentCourt filings revealed



roommate, Robinson wrote: "I had enough of his hatred. Some hate can't be negotiated out."He also left a note hidden under a keyboard that read: "I had the opportunity to take out Charlie Kirk and I'm going to take it."When his partner asked if it was a prank, Robinson replied:

"I am still ok my love,

but am stuck in Orem for

a little while longer yet. Shouldn't be long until I can come home, but I gotta grab my rifle still... To be honest I had hoped to keep this secret till I died of old age. I am sorry to involve you."Pressed further on whether he was the shooter, Robinson confirmed: "I am, I'm sorry."Transcript of key text exchanges* Partner: I thought they caught the person?Robinson: no, they grabbed some crazy old dude... I planned to grab my rifle from my drop point... most of that side of town got locked down.

Khalistani Outfit Threatens Siege of **Indian Consulate**

■ "Espionage and Intimidation on Canadian Soil," Group Alleges; Poster Targets High Commissioner

Vancouver: Sikhs for Justice (SFJ), a US-based pro-Khalistan group, has issued a fresh threat to "siege" the Indian Consulate in Vancouver on Thursday. The group accused Indian consulates in Canada of running spy networks targeting Khalistanis, and released a poster depicting the new Indian High Commissioner, Dinish Patnaik, with a target on his face. SFJ urged Indo-Canadians with planned visits to the Vancouver consulate to reschedule. In its statement, the group claimed the alleged surveillance has been ongoing, describing threats as so severe that the Royal Canadian Mounted Police had to offer witness protection to Inderjeet Singh Gosal, who succeeded Hardeep



Singh Nijjar as head of the Khalistan Referendum campaign following Nijjar's death.

The allegations include that Indian diplomatic missions are engaged in espionage and intimidation of Khalistan activists residing in Canada. SFJ references comments by Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, made in Parliament on September 18, 2023, concerning investigations into Indian agents' suggested role in Nijjar's killing.

"India's Been Saying It's Bilateral": Pak **Minister Ishaq Dar's Big Admission**

Dar acknowledges Pakistan requested ceasefire, denies Donald Trump's claims of US mediation in Operation Sindoor

Islamabad: Pakistan's Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar has admitted that India categorically rejected any third-party involvement during Operation Sindoor, reiterating that New Delhi considered the conflict a strictly bilateral matter between the two countries. His remarks directly contradict former US President Donald Trump's repeated

assertions that he had mediated between India and Pakistan.India's stand on mediation Speaking to Al Jazeera, Dar revealed details of his meeting with US Secretary of State Marco Rubio in Washington on July 25. According to him, Rubio made it clear that India had left no room for ambiguity in its position.

Dubai: The Asia Cup 2025 controversy took a new turn as India captain Suryakumar Yadav reportedly told officials he does not want Asian Cricket Council (ACC) chairman Mohsin Naqvi to be part of the trophy presentation ceremony if India win the final. The demand comes in the wake of a heated fallout between the Indian and Pakistani cricket boards over the recent handshake row. According to NDTV, Suryakumar conveyed that he would



prefer not to receive the trophy from Naqvi, who is also the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) chief. The move is being seen as a reaction to Naqvi's role in escalating the matter following the post-match controversy between the two teams. Backdrop of controversy

The tension began after India's seven-wicket victory over Pakistan, when the Indian players did not follow the customary post-match handshake. Pakistan, in protest, withdrew from the presentation ceremony. The PCB later lodged a complaint against ICC

match referee Andy Pycroft, accusing him of influencing protocol at the toss and not ensuring the exchange of team sheets. The ICC rejected the PCB's complaint and demand to remove Pycroft from the panel, prompting threats from Pakistan of pulling out of the Asia Cup. The fallout also led to the dismissal of PCB's director of cricket operations, Usman Walha, after it was revealed he had failed to brief captain Salman Ali Agha on tournament rules.
