



BIG WIN FOR CARAMBOLIM RESIDENTS

■ Stop-Work Order Issued to Carambolim Project After Villagers Flag Project



Panaji: The Town and Country Planning (TCP) Department has issued a show-cause notice along with a stop-work order to the proponents of a proposed residential-cum-commercial project at Carambolim in Tiswadi taluka, following complaints by villagers alleging violations of planning norms.

The notice, dated January 6, 2026, pertains to the technical clearance granted on January 14, 2025, for construction of a residential and commercial building,

swimming pool and compound wall at Survey No. 25/2 of Carambolim village. The action follows a complaint submitted by villagers on December 4, 2025, alleging that the clearance was issued without following the due process of law.

Based on the complaint, the TCP department conducted a joint site inspection on December 5, 2025, in the presence of villagers, the complainant, Panchayat representatives, project proponents' representatives and the MLA of St Andre constituency.



During the inspection, villagers pointed out that the mandatory distance from an existing crematorium platform

Govt Will Not Compromise on Legal Compliance: Vishwajit Rane

Panaji: A Show Cause Notice-cum-Stop Work Order has been issued in connection with the proposed residential-cum-commercial building, swimming pool and compound wall at Carambolim village in Tiswadi taluka, following serious concerns over site conditions and compliance with statutory norms.



Confirming the action, TCP Minister Vishwajit Rane said that the decision was taken after a joint site inspection conducted on the basis of a formal representation

received by the authorities. "Following the inspection, several issues relating to site conditions and compliance were recorded. Accordingly, all construction activity at the site has been ordered to be stopped with immediate effect until further orders," Rane stated.

PWD Submits ₹7,700 Crore Road Projects to Centre

■ Pledges Swift Action on Road Complaints

Panaji: Goa Public Works Minister Digambar Kamat said that road projects worth around ₹7,700 crore were submitted to Union Minister Nitin Gadkari during his recent visit to Delhi, along with former Chief Minister U.P. Parsekar. Most of the proposals were accompanied by detailed project reports (DPRs). Kamat also stated that 12 specific projects worth ₹102 crore were submitted to the Union Urban Development

Minister, who has assured a personal review of the proposals. The files have already been forwarded to the Finance Minister for further action. Highlighting ongoing maintenance efforts, Kamat added that all potholes on main roads have been cleared. He urged the public to report complaints via his mobile, promising resolution within 24 hours. "The condition of roads can win or lose elections," he said, stressing the importance of citizen feedback and prompt governance.



Accused On Four Day Remand As Honeytrap Espionage Probe Deepens

New Delhi: A man identified as Sunil has been placed on a four day police remand as investigators intensify questioning to uncover the full scope of an alleged espionage case in Ambala. Officials are examining whether he acted independently or as part of a larger network, with further revelations expected during sustained interrogation.

Investigators suspect that the operation involved a sophisticated honeytrap allegedly run through a fake online identity.

Goa Govt Monitoring Heavy Metals in Caranzalem Fish: Fisheries Min

■ 2 Drones To Curb Illegal Fishing In Goa

Panaji: Fisheries Minister Nilkanth Halankar has said that the government is closely monitoring reports of heavy metal accumulation in fish caught off Caranzalem beach. "The National Institute of Oceanography (NIO) and Goa University are conducting continuous research on the matter,"



Halankar said, adding that the government will take appropriate action if the findings indicate any risk to public health.

The Minister's

statement comes amid growing concern over the safety of seafood consumed by coastal communities and residents in Goa.

The study noted that metals like iron, manganese, zinc, and copper were unevenly distributed across fish organs, with the kidney showing the highest

Gharan Restaurant Gutted in Major Fire at Porvorim

■ Rs 25-30 lakh loss estimated

Porvorim: A major fire completely gutted Gharan Restaurant, located near Sai Service at Porvorim, in the wee hours of Tuesday, causing heavy financial losses to the owner.

The fire reportedly broke out at around 4.30 am, when the establishment was closed.

Fire tenders from the Porvorim Fire Station rushed to the spot immediately after receiving the alert. As the blaze intensified, additional reinforcements from the Fire and Emergency Services (FES) headquarters at St Inez were pressed into service.

After sustained efforts,



firefighters managed to bring the fire under control, preventing it from spreading to nearby structures.

However, by the time the flames were doused, the restaurant had been completely gutted, with furniture, kitchen equipment and interior fittings reduced to ashes.

The owner has estimated the loss at approximately ₹25 lakh. No casualties were reported in the incident. The exact cause of the fire is yet to be ascertained, though a short circuit is suspected. Further investigation is underway.

Goa Resignations Lay Bare AAP's Growing Pains

The exit of senior Aam Aadmi Party leaders in Goa is not just another episode of internal churn. It is a telling moment for a party that once claimed moral high ground by promising a new kind of politics. When a former state president, an acting president and key youth leaders quit together, the message is hard to ignore. Something fundamental is not working.

AAP entered Goa with ambition and confidence. It positioned itself as an alternative to established parties, arguing that voters deserved cleaner politics, internal democracy and accountable leadership. In the 2022 Assembly elections, it projected itself aggressively, even naming a chief ministerial face. But the promise has steadily faded. Poor electoral performances, capped by the recent Zilla Panchayat elections where the party barely registered a presence, have exposed the gap between rhetoric and reality.

Electoral losses alone do not usually trigger such high-profile exits. Parties lose elections all the time and regroup. What makes the Goa resignations significant is the reasoning offered by those who left. Their central complaint was not just about results, but about how decisions were taken. The allegation of excessive centralisation, of instructions flowing from the top without adequate consultation, strikes at the core of AAP's political identity.

AAP was built on the idea that politics could be participatory and decentralised. Its early success in Delhi rested on the claim that ordinary workers and local leaders had a voice. When leaders in Goa say that they felt sidelined, unheard and undermined, it suggests that the party may have drifted from its founding principles as it expanded.

This is a familiar story in Indian politics. Many parties that begin as movements struggle when they transition into national players. Expansion demands structure, discipline and

coordination, but it also tests a party's tolerance for internal debate. In AAP's case, the balance appears to have tilted too far towards control. The removal of a state president and the handling of dissent seem to have deepened mistrust rather than resolved differences.

Goa, in particular, is not a state where central templates work easily. Its politics is shaped by local networks, regional identities and shifting alliances. Success there requires patience, flexibility and deep engagement with grassroots realities. A rigid, centrally driven strategy risks alienating local leaders who understand these nuances

better than any national command.

There was also a strategic question that AAP never fully answered in Goa. Was it serious about building a long-term organisation, or was it chasing quick electoral breakthroughs? Contesting aggressively without building alliances or consolidating a base left the party isolated. When results failed to match expectations, accountability became a contentious issue. In such moments, the way leadership responds matters as much as the outcome itself.

The resignations should worry AAP beyond Goa. They raise uncomfortable questions about how the party handles disagreement across states. If leaders who invested time and credibility feel compelled to walk out rather than stay and fight internally, it signals a breakdown of trust. For a party that prides itself on being different from traditional outfits, this perception is damaging.

For voters, the episode reinforces a simple truth. Political alternatives are judged not only by what they promise during campaigns, but by how they function when under pressure. Internal democracy cannot be selective. It must survive defeats, dissent and disagreement. Otherwise, it risks becoming just another slogan. AAP still has an opportunity to course-correct. That would require honest introspection, not defensive posturing. Listening to departing voices, empowering state units and accepting that regional strategies cannot always be dictated from the centre would be a start. Political growth, after all, is not just about expanding territory but about nurturing trust within.

If the party treats the Goa episode as an isolated rebellion, it will miss the larger warning. If it treats it as feedback, however uncomfortable, it may yet preserve the credibility that once set it apart. Indian politics has space for alternatives, but only for those willing to practise internally what they preach publicly.

Canacona Congress Demands Immediate Relief Package for Farmers Affected by October Unseasonal Rains

CANACONA: Alleging continued neglect of farmers who suffered heavy crop losses due to unseasonal rains in October 2025, the Canacona Congress has demanded the immediate disbursement of compensation to affected cultivators.

Canacona Congress Frontal Committees (CCFC), led by former



Assembly Congress candidate Janardhan Bhandari, met Canacona Zonal Agriculture Officer (ZAO) Mahendra Pagi

and questioned the delay in releasing compensation to farmers. "It has been over two months now, yet

not a single farmer who suffered losses due to the October 2025 unseasonal rains has received any compensation or relief," Bhandari stated.

He recalled that unprecedented and unseasonal rainfall across Goa in October 2025 had severely damaged ready-to-harvest paddy fields in Canacona, causing significant losses to local farmers.

Woman Tourist Injured After Two-Wheeler Plunges Off Unsafe Agonda Culvert Bridge

CANACONA: A woman tourist riding a two-wheeler sustained serious injuries after plunging off the unsafe Agonda box culvert bridge on Monday night. The accident occurred when the tourist was attempting to cross the culvert bridge at Agonda. While riding across, the two-wheeler reportedly veered towards the extreme edge of the bridge and went over the unprotected wing wall, plunging into the waterless portion of the Agonda river during low tide.

The woman was found lying injured beside the damaged two-wheeler. Local residents, who rushed to the spot immediately after the incident, provided initial assistance and alerted emergency services. She was later shifted to the Canacona Community Health Centre (CHC) in a 108 ambulance for medical treatment.

Incidentally, the



two-wheeler fell over the side wing walls that were erected as retaining structures near the bridge abutments to support the approach roads. However, these wing walls lack proper protective railings.

The box culvert bridge, constructed about two years ago, was opened to traffic even before the completion of approach roads on both sides. Though wing walls and railings were installed later, they cover only limited portions of the bridge. Large sections of the bridge and approach roads remain unfinished and without adequate safety barriers.

CM Reviews Veterinary College, Fisheries Sector Projects

PANAJI: Chief Minister Dr Pramod Sawant chaired a high-level review meeting on the Veterinary College at Panaji with senior government officials, including Secretaries and Heads of concerned departments.

During the



meeting, discussions centred on meeting the June deadline for commencement of the Veterinary

College, fast-tracking completion of the campus, procurement of necessary equipment, establishment of the

veterinary hospital and clinical complex, and creation of required teaching and non-teaching posts.

The Chief Minister also reviewed key issues related to the proposed Fisheries College, including its affiliation with Goa University, availability of land, and transport connectivity.

Goa's tourism ecosystem does not revolve around Sunburn event: Khaunte

Panaji: Tourism Minister Rohan Khaunte said Goa's tourism strategy does not hinge on any single event such as the Sunburn music festival, even as he assured strict action in the case of a woman tourist allegedly harassed during the event. Speaking to the media, Khaunte said Goa has successfully hosted a variety of festivals that attract both domestic and international visitors. He cited the recent Raponkaranche Festival as an example, stating that it drew tourists from across India and abroad. "Goa must come up with different ideas. We cannot depend only on one festival like Sunburn," the Tourism Minister said, underlining the need to diversify the state's tourism offerings. Reacting to comments by MLA Michael Lobo on the importance of Sunburn to Goa's tourism economy, Khaunte said Lobo was entitled to



his opinion. However, he stressed that while events are important, there must be zero tolerance for incidents that tarnish Goa's image or compromise tourist safety. His remarks come in the wake of a viral video showing the alleged harassment of a woman tourist during the Sunburn festival. Condemning the incident, Khaunte said any attempt to outrage the modesty of a woman would not be tolerated. "I have spoken to Chief Minister Dr Pramod Sawant regarding the incident. The Tourism Department has filed a police complaint and I am personally monitoring the matter. Strict action will be taken against the accused," Khaunte said. He added that individuals involved in such acts have no place in Goa.

Mungul Gang War Case Sent to South Goa Sessions Court for Trial

Margao: The Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court in Margao has formally sent the Mungul gang clash case to the South Goa Sessions Court, clearing the way for the commencement of trial proceedings.

Acting under provisions of Section 232 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, the Magistrate ordered all accused persons who are presently on bail to remain present before the Sessions Court on January 17, 2025, at 10 a.m. The court has directed that the Public Prosecutor attached to the Sessions Court be notified in advance regarding the scheduled appearance of the accused.


As part of procedural compliance, the Magistrate instructed court officials to immediately transfer all seized material evidence submitted by the investigating agency to the Sessions Court.

"I Gave My Time, Career and Family to the Party": Palekar

president following AAP's poor performance in the recent Zilla Parishad elections. He said his decision was rooted in self-respect and a growing disconnect between the party's founding ideals and its current functioning.

Twenty-Two Rescued From Drowning, Two Missing Children Traced Along Goa Coast Over New Year Weekend

Panaji: Drishti Marine lifesavers carried out multiple rescue and assistance operations along Goa's coastline over the first weekend of 2026, rescuing 22 persons from drowning, tracing two missing children and administering first aid to five others. The incidents occurred as beaches across the state continued to witness heavy tourist



footfall following New Year celebrations.

At Arambol Beach, a 36-year-old Russian tourist was rescued from nearly 50 metres into the sea by lifesavers Vishnu

Kubal and Sandeep Mapankar using a rescue tube and jet ski.

At Mandrem Beach, first aid was provided to a person who sustained a scratch on the right leg while navigating a rocky stretch at Ashwem. The assistance was rendered by lifesaver Sudhir Parab.

At Morjim Beach, three tourists — two men from Delhi and a Russian woman — were saved in a triple rescue operation

by lifesavers Prathmesh Kubal and Babaji Naik using a rescue board and jet ski.

At Baga Beach, two separate rescue incidents were reported. A 25-year-old man from Karnataka was rescued using a rescue tube by lifesaver Mahesh Kamabli, while a 60-year-old Russian tourist was rescued by Ankur Choudhary and Sushant Gaonkar using a rescue board and jet ski.



Best Tourism Village Awardee Khotigao Gets New Sarpanch

CANACONA: Jayesh Gaonkar has been unanimously elected as the new Sarpanch of the Khotigao Village Panchayat, a village that earned national recognition as a Best Tourism Village (Bronze Category) in 2023.

Gaonkar was elected unopposed to head the seven-member Khotigao Village Panchayat following the resignation of incumbent Sarpanch Vrunda Velip. Velip, who was elected in 2024, stepped down on personal grounds after proceeding on long leave. During her absence, the responsibilities of the Sarpanch were handled

by Deputy Sarpanch Poonam Gaonkar.

The election was conducted by the Canacona Block Development Officer's office, with a deputed presiding officer overseeing the proceedings in the presence of the Panchayat Secretary. The presiding officer formally declared Jayesh Gaonkar elected unopposed, making him the third Sarpanch of the current panchayat term.

Several panch members, including Deputy Sarpanch Poonam Gaonkar, former Sarpanch Anandu Desai, Panch member Krishna Velip, and others, were present during the election.

South Goa Crime Figures 2025: Marginal Rise In Cases, Detection Improves

Margao: Crime in South Goa witnessed a marginal rise in 2025, while police succeeded in improving the overall detection rate, according to official comparative crime statistics

released for the period from January 1 to December 31, 2025. As per the data, a total of 878 crime cases were registered in South Goa during 2025, slightly higher than the 865 cases reported in the corresponding period of

2024. Of these, 762 cases were detected, resulting in a detection rate of 86.79 per cent, an improvement over the 85.90 per cent recorded last year.

Serious crimes such as murder and attempt to murder remained largely



stable, with 12 murder cases and 13 attempt-to-murder cases reported in 2025, almost on par with 2024 figures. Rape cases, however, showed a decline, with 40 cases registered in 2025 compared to 44 in the previous year.

One Killed In Two-Wheeler Collision Near Bhoma Adcona

Ponda: A fatal road accident claimed the life of a scooter rider near the Bhoma Adcona Village Panchayat area in Ponda on the night of January 4, 2026.

According to a state complaint filed by HC 5407 Ritesh Rane of Mardol Police Station, the incident occurred at around 9.00 pm when the accused rider, Vishwajit Gaude, a resident of Kundai, Ponda, was riding a Hero Splendor motorcycle in a rash and negligent manner. Police stated that the accused endangered human life by failing to exercise proper care and caution while proceeding from Banastari towards Kundai.


When the motorcycle reached near the Bhoma Adcona Village Panchayat, it allegedly collided with an oncoming Vespa scooter that was travelling from Kundai towards Banastari. As a result of the collision, the scooter rider, Mukund Sarnaik, a resident of Madkai, Ponda, sustained



serious head injuries and was rushed to Goa Medical College (GMC), Bambolim, where he later succumbed to his injuries.

Police conducted an inquest panchanama and the deceased's body was sent for post-mortem examination. The police surgeon who conducted the autopsy certified the cause of death as "head injury as a result of blunt force impact." Viscera samples have been preserved for toxicology examination. The body was later handed over to the family members for final rites.

Further investigation in the case is being carried out by PSI Nitesh Kankonkar of Mardol Police Station.



Minor Girl Reported Missing From Cortalim; Kidnapping Suspected

Cortalim: A case of a missing minor girl has been registered at Verna Police Station following a complaint filed by her mother, a resident of Cortalim and native of Bihar. According to the complaint, the minor girl left her residence on January 2, 2026, at around 5.00 pm without informing any family member and failed to return home thereafter. After making efforts to locate her daughter, the complainant approached the police and expressed strong suspicion that a man identified as Rajiv Paswan, a native of Bihar who was reportedly friendly with the minor, may have kidnapped her from the lawful guardianship of her parents. Based on the complaint, police have initiated necessary legal proceedings and launched a search operation to trace the missing girl.

Appeal Made To Mamledar For Dialogue And Clear Guidelines On Bodgeshwar Jatra Rides

In a letter dated



January 5, 2026, addressed to the Mamledar, the signatories, identifying themselves as devotees of Shree Dev Bodgeshwar and

representatives of local stakeholders, expressed concern over the recent sealing of the giant wheel and other amusement rides.

Dabolim Flyover Likely To Be Completed By December, Says PWD Min

Dabolim: PWD Minister Digambar Kamat said that the much-awaited Dabolim flyover project is likely to be completed by December, following a joint review meeting held in the constituency along with Minister Mauvin Godinho to address long-pending infrastructure and road-related issues.

Kamat was speaking to reporters after the meeting, which was held in the presence of newly elected Zilla



Panchayat member Sunil Gawas and other local representatives. The discussions focused on ongoing and proposed Public Works Department (PWD) works in Dabolim, the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI)

flyover project, and road issues under Zilla Panchayat jurisdiction in Sancoale. The PWD Minister said he had visited Dabolim at the request of Minister Mauvin Godinho to personally review several pending

works. "Many projects have already commenced, while estimates for some others have been prepared. I have assured that approvals will be granted within eight days so that these works can also begin without delay," Kamat said. India Emerges As Largest Rice Producer, Surpasses China

■ Record output and new crop varieties mark a major milestone in the country's food security journey

New Delhi: India has emerged as the world's largest producer of rice, overtaking China with a record output of 150.18 million tonnes, Union Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan announced in New Delhi. The achievement places India at the top of global rice production, ahead of China's output of 145.28 million tonnes, and underscores the country's growing strength in agricultural productivity.

The announcement was made at an event where the minister released 184 newly developed varieties spanning 25 crops, a move aimed at further boosting yields, resilience, and farmer incomes. The new varieties have been developed through



sustained research and innovation in the agricultural sector, reflecting India's long-term focus on seed technology and crop improvement.

Highlighting the significance of the milestone, the minister said India's success in developing high-yielding and climate-resilient seeds has transformed the country from a food-deficient nation into a major global food supplier. He described the rise in rice production as unprecedented and noted

that India is now playing a critical role in supplying rice to international markets while maintaining robust domestic availability.

The minister also emphasised that the country currently holds adequate foodgrain stocks, ensuring national food security even as exports continue. He directed officials to ensure that the newly released seed varieties reach farmers without delay, stressing that timely access to improved seeds is essential for sustaining production gains and supporting rural livelihoods.

Since the crop variety notification process began in 1969, a total of 7,205 varieties have been officially notified in the

country. Of these, 3,236 high-yielding varieties have been approved in recent years, reflecting an accelerated push towards modernising Indian agriculture and improving farm productivity.

The 184 newly released varieties include 122 cereals, six pulses, 13 oilseeds, 11 fodder crops, six sugarcane varieties, and 24 cotton varieties, including 22 Bt cotton types. In addition, one variety each of jute and tobacco has also been introduced. Together, these releases are expected to strengthen crop diversity, enhance resistance to pests and climate stress, and reinforce India's position as a leading agricultural producer on the global stage.



Falling Oil Prices Set To Keep Inflation Well Below 3.4% In FY27

■ Lower Energy Costs Likely To Support Growth And Ease Price Pressures

New Delhi: India's inflation outlook is expected to improve significantly over the next financial year as global crude oil prices trend lower, providing relief on both prices and growth. Projections indicate that crude prices could decline sharply to around 50 dollars per barrel by mid 2026, helping keep consumer price inflation decisively below 3.4 percent in FY27.

Softening energy prices are also expected to provide a modest boost to economic growth. Lower fuel costs typically reduce input expenses across sectors, improve household purchasing power, and ease pressure on government finances. The combined effect could add an estimated 10 to 15 basis points to annual GDP growth, supporting broader economic momentum.

Global crude markets are witnessing increased supply and rising inventories, which are weighing on prices. Brent crude is projected to average close to 55 dollars per barrel in early 2026, a trend that has direct implications for India given the near perfect correlation between Brent prices and the Indian crude basket. This close linkage suggests that further declines in global prices are likely to translate into softer

domestic energy costs.

Technical indicators reinforce the outlook for continued moderation. Current Indian crude prices are trading below both short term and long term moving averages, pointing to a downward bias. Forecast models indicate that prices could ease to nearly 53 dollars per barrel by March 2026 and fall further to around 52 dollars by June 2026.

As India follows a dynamic daily fuel pricing mechanism, declines in crude prices are expected to gradually pass through to retail fuel prices. Historical trends show a moderate transmission to the fuel component of the consumer price index, which plays a key role in shaping headline inflation.

A projected correction of about 14 percent in crude prices during the final quarter of FY26 could exert notable downward pressure on inflation in FY27. Even with partial pass through, this moderation is expected to pull average inflation well below the 3.4 percent mark.

Additionally, softer oil prices may support the rupee by improving the trade balance. Currency appreciation could further dampen imported inflation, reinforcing the overall disinflationary trend and strengthening macroeconomic stability going into FY27.

had not been maintained as per rules. It was also observed that the required right of way roads of 15 metres and 10 metres on the southern and western sides of the property, as shown in the proposal, were not available at site.

In view of these discrepancies, the TCP department has directed the project proponents to show cause within seven

working days as to why the technical clearance issued earlier should not be revoked. Pending a final decision, authorities have ordered that all construction activity at the site be stopped with immediate effect.

The order, issued by Deputy Town Planner Manguirish N. Verenkar, has been forwarded to the Carambolim Village Panchayat with directions

to ensure that the ongoing work, if any, is halted. Copies of the notice have also been sent to the villagers for information.

The development comes amid growing concerns among residents over large-scale construction projects in Carambolim, with locals demanding stricter enforcement of planning and environmental regulations.

Chenab Projects Put On Fast Track As Centre Signals No More Delays

■ Fast-tracked dams in Jammu and Kashmir signal strategic shift on Indus basin water management

New Delhi: India has moved decisively to accelerate four major hydropower projects on the Chenab river system, turning long discussed water strategy into on-ground execution in Jammu and Kashmir. The Centre has issued firm instructions to fast-track construction timelines, placing strong emphasis on delivery and operational readiness.

Under the revised schedule, the Pakal Dul and Kiru hydropower projects are to be



commissioned by December 2026. The Kwar project has been given a completion target of March 2028, while construction at the strategically sensitive Ratle dam has been

ordered to progress at an accelerated pace. The directive followed a two-day inspection by Union Power Minister Manohar Lal Khattar, who reviewed multiple dam sites and

underlined that timelines would no longer be flexible.

The developments carry implications beyond power generation. The Chenab forms a critical part of the Indus basin, which supplies the majority of Pakistan's water needs. A large share of Pakistan's agriculture, dams, and canal networks depend on rivers that originate in India. As a result, infrastructure activity on the Chenab is closely monitored across the border.



Mining Vehicles Must Be GPS-Tracked, Says Uttarakhand High Court

■ Court Orders Integration With Ramanna Portal Amid Illegal Soapstone Mining Concerns

New Delhi: The Uttarakhand High Court has directed that all vehicles involved in mining operations must be equipped with GPS devices and integrated with the Ramanna Portal to enable real-time monitoring and data tracking. The observation was made during a hearing on damage caused to buildings and infrastructure due to soapstone mining in parts of Bageshwar district.

A division bench comprising Chief Justice G. Narendra and Justice Subhash Upadhyay was hearing a public interest litigation highlighting cracks in houses and other structures in several villages affected by mining activity. The court said GPS-based tracking would help authorities maintain transparency in mineral transportation and curb irregularities.

During the proceedings, the bench noted that integrating vehicle data with the Ramanna Portal would allow continuous surveillance of movement and timing. The court directed the state government to implement the tracking mechanism within one week and ensure strict compliance with existing mining regulations.

The observations followed the submission of a report by the Bageshwar District Mining Officer, which flagged serious discrepancies in transportation records. According to the findings, mining vehicles showed travel distances of around 55 kilometres being completed in 12 to 18 hours, a duration the court said was not practically feasible and indicated possible manipulation of records.

Pakistan Turned To Washington To Restrain India's Operation Sindoor

■ US Filings Reveal Intensive Lobbying Push During 2025 Military Escalation

New Delhi: New US government filings have revealed that Pakistan launched an intense lobbying campaign in Washington in an attempt to halt India's military operation, Operation Sindoor, following the Pahalgam terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir in 2025.

The disclosures show that Pakistani diplomats and defence



officials sought dozens of engagements with senior US administration

figures, lawmakers, defence officials, and influential media outlets

during the height of the conflict. The outreach was aimed at pressing Washington to intervene and curb India's military momentum.

Records indicate that more than 50 meetings and communications were pursued through emails, phone calls, and in person interactions, reflecting a coordinated diplomatic effort rather than routine engagement.

Sonia Gandhi Admitted To Sir Ganga Ram Hospital

■ Congress Leader Hospitalised For Routine Observation

New Delhi: Congress leader Sonia Gandhi has been admitted to Sir Ganga Ram Hospital in New Delhi as a precautionary measure. Sources said her condition is stable and there is no cause for concern.

She has been kept under observation by a chest physician due to a long standing issue of chronic cough. The admission is described as routine, especially given the impact of air pollution in the capital, which often aggravates respiratory conditions.

Sonia Gandhi was admitted on Monday



evening for regular medical evaluation. Doctors are carrying out standard check ups, and no emergency treatment has been required.

The senior Congress leader, who turned 79 in December 2025, has undergone periodic health assessments in recent years. Hospital sources indicated that she is responding well and is comfortable.

"Elections Are The Only Way Forward": India Backs Nepal's Democratic Process

■ Ajit Doval Meets Prachanda As New Delhi Signals Support For March Polls

New Delhi: India has expressed strong support for Nepal's upcoming general elections, underscoring the importance of a democratic mandate to restore political stability in the neighbouring country. The message was conveyed during a high-level meeting in New Delhi between India's National Security Adviser Ajit Doval and former Nepal prime minister Pushpa Kamal Dahal, widely known as Prachanda.

The meeting took place late on January 4 and focused on Nepal's political transition following

months of uncertainty triggered by widespread Gen Z-led protests last year. Those protests ultimately led to the collapse of the KP Sharma Oli government, plunging the country into a period of instability. Against this backdrop, Nepal has announced general elections scheduled for March 5 as a pathway to political resolution.

During the discussions, Doval emphasised that elections are not merely a constitutional formality but a critical necessity to protect Nepal's democratic system. He conveyed India's view that a clear



electoral mandate is the most effective way to address the current impasse and ensure long-term national stability. The dialogue highlighted New Delhi's interest in a stable and democratic Nepal, rooted in institutional legitimacy and public consent.

The meeting, hosted by Doval over dinner, served as an opportunity to assess the political

situation and reinforce the urgency of moving forward with the announced polls. The emphasis remained on democracy as the cornerstone of governance and the ballot box as the most credible mechanism to resolve political transitions.

Prachanda, who leads the Nepal Communist Party, responded by assuring that there is broad political consensus within Nepal in favour of holding elections. He indicated that major political parties are aligned on the need for polls and are not opposed to the electoral process.

Bangladesh Requests Time to Decide on T20 World Cup Matches in India

■ ICC Works to Resolve Bangladesh Concerns Ahead of T20 World Cup in India

New Delhi: The Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) has asked the International Cricket Council (ICC) for time to consult with its government before responding to a request to relocate its T20 World Cup matches from India. The ICC has been engaging with both the BCB and the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) to find a resolution as the tournament approaches in just a month.

Internal meetings were held by the ICC in Mumbai and Dubai on Monday, aiming to address the concerns while minimizing disruption to the event. Relocating Bangladesh's matches at this stage would present significant



logistical challenges, given the proximity of the tournament and ongoing preparations.

The ICC has indicated it is open to minor adjustments in the schedule and has assured Bangladesh of top-level security if the team continues to play its matches in India. A formal communication

from the ICC is expected soon, though no immediate decisions will be taken. The governing body is also preparing contingency plans in case relocation becomes necessary.

Bangladesh is scheduled to play three of its four group-stage matches at Eden Gardens, with the fourth in Mumbai.

The team is part of Group C alongside England, West Indies, Nepal, and Italy. Any changes in the schedule could have a wider impact, particularly if Bangladesh advances to the Super Eights, and would also affect online ticketing, broadcasters, and traveling media.

Officials have cited the incident-free 2023 ODI World Cup during Pakistan's tour of India as a precedent for successfully hosting matches without disruption. While the ICC continues to encourage Bangladesh to play in India, the final decision will ultimately depend on discussions between the BCB, the BCCI, and the government.



Road to the 2026 Chess World Championship Begins With Candidates Line-Ups Finalized

■ Elite Players Clash in Cyprus for World Championship Spots

New Delhi: The stage is set for the next World Chess Championship, as the line-ups for the 2026 FIDE Candidates Tournaments have been confirmed following the completion of the qualification cycle. After its first North American edition in 2024, the tournament returns to Europe, with Cyprus selected as the host. Both events

will take place at the luxurious Cap St Georges Hotel & Resort near Paphos.

The Open Candidates Tournament promises an exciting mix of established grandmasters and emerging talents, determined by results across the 2024-25 FIDE Circuit, the 2025 World Cup, the 2025 Grand Swiss, and rating-based qualifications.



Goa Aims for Strong Medal Performance at Khelo India Beach Games

■ State sends 32 athletes to compete across multiple disciplines in Diu

Panaji: Goa is gearing up for a promising medal run at the second edition of the Khelo India Beach Games, scheduled in Diu from 5th to 11th January 2026. The event officially commenced on 5th January, bringing together athletes from across India to compete in various beach sports.

The Goan contingent will take part in five disciplines: beach soccer, beach volleyball, sepak takraw, open sea swimming, and pencak silat. The state is targeting podium finishes in key events, including men's beach soccer, men's beach volleyball, women's sepak takraw, men's and women's pencak silat, and men's and women's swimming.

Goa is sending a

total of 32 athletes, supported by seven coaches and managers, to represent the state in these competitions. Officials have expressed confidence that the athletes' preparation and prior experience will help improve on last year's performance.

In the inaugural Khelo India Beach Games held in 2025, Goa finished 18th in the overall medal tally, securing three medals. The state had claimed silver in men's beach soccer and men's doubles sepak takraw, while earning a bronze in individual women's pencak silat. Building on that foundation, Goa hopes to achieve a stronger showing this year with multiple medal prospects across both team and individual events.

Lakshya Sen Moves Ahead, Malvika Bansod Exits Early At Malaysia Open

■ Sen Wins Tight Opener To Reach Second Round While Bansod Exits In Straight Games

New Delhi: India's top shuttler Lakshya Sen started the 2026 season on a strong note, advancing to the second round of the men's singles at the Malaysia Open Super 750 tournament with a hard-fought victory over Singapore's Jia Heng Jason Teh on Tuesday.

The 24-year-old from Almora, who won the Australian Open and

finished runner-up at the Hong Kong Open last season, took 70 minutes to secure a 21-16, 15-21, 21-14 win against world No. 21 Teh in an intense opening clash. Sen, ranked 13th globally and a bronze medallist at the 2021 World Championships, will next face either sixth seed Christo Popov of France or Lee Cheuk Yiu of Hong Kong.

In the women's singles, Malvika Bansod, making her return after a six-month break due to a left knee injury, was handed a straight-game defeat by seventh seed and former world champion Ratchanok Intanon of Thailand, falling 11-21, 11-21 in the opening round.

Later in the day, Ayush Shetty, last year's US Open Super 300



champion, is set to take on Malaysia's Lee Zii Jia, the Paris Olympics bronze medallist.

In men's doubles, the Indian pairing of experienced M R Arjun and 22-year-old Hariharan Amsakarunan will clash with Japan's Hiroki Midorikawa and Kyohei Yamashita, aiming to make a strong start in the tournament.

Neeraj Chopra Launches Own Management Firm, Ends Decade with JSW Sports

■ Neeraj Chopra Starts Vel Sports After Ending Decade-Long Partnership With JSW Sports

New Delhi: Two-time Olympic medallist Neeraj Chopra has ended his ten-year partnership with JSW Sports and announced the launch of his own athlete management company, Vel Sports. Chopra, who has been represented by JSW Sports since 2016, described the collaboration as "defining," highlighting the shared growth and success that shaped his career.

"JSW Sports has played a defining role

in my journey, and I'll always be grateful for their support and vision," Chopra said, noting that the values guiding that partnership will continue to influence his next venture. JSW Sports CEO Divyanshu Singh expressed pride in the collaboration, praising Chopra's achievements as a reflection of their shared commitment to excellence.

During his tenure with JSW Sports, Chopra made history for Indian

athletics. He became the country's first Olympic gold medallist in track and field at Tokyo 2021, won gold at the 2023 World Championships, and secured an Olympic silver at Paris 2024, along with several podium finishes on the international stage. Both Chopra and JSW Sports described the split as amicable, marked by mutual respect and pride.

Chopra's return to competition, however, remains uncertain.



The javelin star is still recovering from a back injury sustained before last year's World Championships, which saw him finish eighth at the Tokyo 2025 edition. World Athletics vice-president and AFI spokesperson Adille Sumariwalla confirmed that Chopra has yet to decide when he will begin his 2026 season, emphasizing that his recovery and fitness will take priority.
